

# **How Many Jumps Are In** A Horse?

A Short Conversation With Oliver Brown

I have a few "go-tos" for different types of equine expertise, but when it comes to basic training and good old-fashioned "horse sense," I ask Oliver Brown.

While planning the summer issue of Horse Times with Emily, my cohort and editor, we decided that we wanted to include an article with Oliver. We chose to ask him if there is any truth to the saying "a horse only has so many jumps in its lifetime." We expected to get some numbers and schedules of sorts on how to preserve and extend the number of jumps in a horse. It made sense that there was some protocol that has the answer, some sort of program to follow.

Well, we didn't get the type of answer that we were expecting, but, we did get the point that

Oliver wanted to convey. Talking with Oliver is aways fun, always interesting, and if you are really

listening...always educational.

So, I posed the question to Oliver, "Does a horse have a limited number of jumps in its lifetime?"

Oliver answered, "No, most horses are just schooled to death."

Then he went on to explain, "My father told me and I often repeat "Don't leave your best jump in the warm-up ring." You should not turn your horse into a factory worker...bored of its job. You need to know when to quit.

More horses need to be happy. Take them on trail rides, jump small logs, ride them out in the fields, go cross-country. Trotting is great, trot up and down hills.

Jumping them over and over in the ring does not improve their jumping, it just dulls and sours them. Your horse needs to look bright in the show ring. You can't accomplish this by drilling jumping, because after a while the excitement is gone.

Most of the time it is the rider who needs to practice and not the horse. If you think that your horse does not understand how to do something, it may be the way he is being asked. Listen to your horse and keep an open mind. Work on developing a better rapport with your horse. It's like having a good dance partner, or a happy marriage.

You, the rider, shouldn't be noticed when a horse is jumping. This is why the communication is so important. You need to be invisible.

Practice anything your horse to develop a better relationship and he will become a better jumper. You need to be prudent and smart at managing your horse. And, don't ask the horse to do something that you are not prepared to do.

Remember, jump heights are irrelevant to the horse...it's only an issue to the rider. Talking to your horse is also unhelpful, but it does relax you.

No horse should be jumped more than twice a week, so if you as a rider need more practice, find another horse."

Oliver's advice is always very simple, but hard to implement. I think that we often needlessly complicate things and therefore make it difficult for our horses. That's what I take away.

# Valley Equine Associates Welcomes New Vet

Dr. Summers Comes Home to West Virginia

Valley Equine Associates of Ranson, WV has added West Virginia native Dr. Claire Summers to its veterinary staff. Originally from Ripley, West Virginia, where she grew up riding Quarter Horses and Tennessee Walking Horses, Dr. Summers graduated from West Virginia University. She then embarked on a career path that combined her passion for travel with veterinary medicine.

Following her undergraduate studies, Dr. Summers worked as an operating room technician and ICU nurse at Virginia Tech's Marion DuPont Scott Equine Medical Center (EMC). She found her work there inspirational. While she sensed that she had always wanted to work in veterinary medicine, her experience there "really solidified it for me," she says. "It was a

fantastic learning experience."

A number of the interns and residents at the EMC were from Australia, and encouraged her to consider attending vet school there. She had never been to Australia, but when she was accepted to the vet school at Murdoch University in Perth, Dr. Summers recalls that she thought "Heck, I can't turn that down," especially since one of her Australian friends at the EMC offered living arrangements, making the transition easier.

At vet school, Dr. Summers served as the Western Australia Student Representative for Equine Veterinarians of Australia. She also did research involving methods of harvesting eggs from the ovaries of horses, comparing two different methods.

During her time in vet school, Dr. Summers travelled to

Thailand to work on improving the care of elephants, where they are considered livestock and also perform an important role in tourism. She had previously volunteered with organizations that provide veterinary care to dogs and cats in Peru.

As a vet student, Dr. Summers was honored to receive several awards including the Murdoch University Summer Research Scholarship, the Bain Fallon Young Member Scholarship, and the EVA Young Members Group Scientific Poster Award, for the research she presented at the Equine Veterinarians Australia Bain Fallon Memorial Conference.

Upon completion of her studies Dr. Summers returned to the U.S. and did an equine medicine and surgery internship in Wyoming, went on to equine practice in Colorado and Montana, and recently returned home to West Virginia.

"I like the western, ranching way of life, and wide-open spaces," she says, "But it seemed like time to come home. I'd been away for over a decade."

Equine's practice (located right next to the Charles Town Races) involves spending about half of most days working on horses at the track, which Dr. Summers finds very interesting, and the other half of a typical day involves farm calls that run the gamut of equine veterinary medicine, from lameness dentistry to reproductive medicine, just to name a few. "It's a great mix of work, and it's good to be home," says Dr. Summers.






Auction......from p. 17 say?" Knowing how much Greg "loves ponies," she was also expecting that it was not going to be well-received.

When I told her he said, "Buy what you want, how much can it be?" we both shrugged our shoulders and proceeded to investigate more things.

We took our position as little hip number 2 entered the ring. Luckily, he went for almost \$1,000, which was quite a bit more than I was willing to pay for a puppy.

As I was waiting for my other pony to be brought in (several hours later), we visited with other people we knew, I bought a saddle, and considered giving a good home to a couple more ponies that I thought needed some

Then we spent some time talking with Dr. Keith Berkeley of Valley Veterinary Associates, which was a good thing, because he reminded me that I may have momentarily lost some of my common sense...I decided to stick with just one pony.

He also gave me a reminder to

keep anything brought home from any auction quarantined for at least two, preferably three weeks. More good advice.

Finally, my pony -- the last one of the night -- entered the ring. I have to admit, that after waiting all that time, I was not going to easily let her go. I thought \$600 was a good price and we were done. I would come pick her up in the morning.

I was very proud of myself for showing restraint and only buying one pony and a Crosby saddle for \$75. When I arrived home, I shared the details of my purchases with Greg, who said, "You bought a pony!!??" I said, "Yes, I asked you if I could buy some things. I was at a horse auction, what did you think I meant?" Well, since I said I was going early for the tack, he thought that's all I was shopping for. LOL.

I spoke to Tim Smith, the owner of RSD, a couple days after the sale to see what he thought of the event. He confirmed the crowd was above average, but not as big as their New Year's Day sale. He said the horses brought good prices, and that there were

ten horses that were "no-saled." He was concerned that people understand that when a horse is "no-saled" it is not because nobody bids, but because the buyer has set a reserve on the price for which they will allow the horse to be sold.

He also said they ran out of BBQ and burgers. After all, it is a social event...I guess people were also there for the food.

Tim confirmed that 56 head of horses went through the sale. There were a variety of breeds and disciplines, and most were broke to ride.

All in all, it was nice to be out again in what for the most part was "business as usual."

As for our new pony, the grandkids came out the next day and we gave her a bath. I think she'll be just fine.

# The Importance of Barn Records

Start With a Stall Card and Build Your Book From There By Dawn Bellinger

What would happen to your barn if you got sick and someone else, who didn't know your horses, had to come in to take care of them? How would that person know what they eat, when they last had their last vaccines, their allergies, or their condition? If you have boarders, they would also need the owner's contact, vet and farrier information. And, it would be nice to mention any of your horses' stable vices.

Why wait until you own a barn of your own to start keeping track of all of these things and more? Pony Club teaches its members to track all of this information from the minute you become a member. Any rider can create a Stall Card for their horse or pony. If you take your horse to a show and stay overnight in a stall, you should affix it to the stall door. Google "stall card template" and you'll have a number of choices.



Pony Club.....from p. 25 someone to identify which pony goes in each stall.

The stall card is the kernel of your barn records. To create your full record book, just expand on your stall card for each horse in your barn. Again, any rider can create a record book for any horse or pony they take care of regularly. Pony Club teaches members to start their record book almost as soon as they join. By the time that member is testing for higher certifications, their record books are full and complete for each horse they have ridden regularly.

When my daughter got her first horse at age 17, she already had records for nine prior leased horses. Keeping track of one more was easy.

Building on the stall card, you should add a feed schedule and a detailed list of routine care (vaccines, deworming, shoeing, vet visits, and dental care) for each horse. Add a conditioning schedule for each horse to include special tack or equipment you use. Finally, create a section of your notebook to track the costs so that you know how much you're spending!

Creating a record for each horse you own or lease or even just ride regularly will teach you what you need to know to care for your own barn full of horses.

Then, by the time you're a barn owner yourself, you'll know how to keep track of every horse in your barn and how much it will cost. Start by creating your stall card and then work on your own Barn Record Book. It's never too soon to begin!






#### 2020 VPBA Monetary Awards







As a real estate agent who specializes in equestrian and country properties in Loudoun, Fauquier, Prince William and Clarke Counties, it's not unusual to be asked, "How's the real estate market for a property like mine?"

What this means is that while we have taken a severe hit, our area is very resilient. Nowhere is this displayed more clearly than the sale of Newstead Farm in Upperville which closed in March 2020. Listed at \$10 million dollars, it was one of the Virginia countryside's most expensive estates. A premiere equestrian facility and a mansion with a rich history, it was also a property with a very small pool of potential buyers. The buyers had also looked at farms in Kentucky, but Newstead won them over based, at least partially, on the strong economic foundation of the greater Washington DC area.

### **Inventory and Interest Rates**

The inventory of homes for sale in our area is critically low. For farm properties, the inventory shortage is even more so.

Another driving force for the strong market are very low interest rates for home loans. While government backed loans such as FHA and USDA loans have

This was very apparent in my next example. However, she ended up with multiple offers. My buyers wanted the property badly, so we put together the strongest offer we could and prevailed. Horse properties priced at \$700,000 and under are the unicorn properties of our area.

Where once a large lawn was an objection to overcome in terms of cost and/or time for mowing it, its now a huge selling point. There's plenty of room to walk around, play with the kids and let the dog(s) run around!

Realtors are seeing an influx of buyers heading west to the country to look at potential second homes or weekend homes. They are also looking for properties with in-law suites or guest houses and even better, a great pool. Our area has competed with beach homes for








# The State Of The Art In Equine Sports Medicine


How Advanced Technologies Treat and Prevent Injuries

Magnetic resonance image (MRI) provides two-dimensional, cross sectional images. MRI imaging is beneficial for soft tissue structures, especially within the hoof capsule. MRI can be done in the standing, sedated horse for imaging up to the level of the fetlock.

Devastating news. Your horse has suffered an injury to a tendon or ligament and your show season or recreational riding is in jeopardy for the foreseeable future. But, thanks to the latest veterinary medical research and innovation, injuries resulting in structural damage to these tissues can be treated with a variety of options to heal them and perhaps ultimately salvage your show season.


Sports medicine can be

defined as the assessment of physical fitness and treatment or prevention of injuries related to sport and exercise. How does that relate to your horse? Horses of any discipline, from trail horse to seasoned eventer, can benefit from recent advances in sports medicine. There is growing movement towards use of *preventative* options to reach and maintain peak health and performance. Supporting your equine athlete with the latest diagnostic and therapeutic modalities ensures your horse will perform effectively.


Invariably, sports medicine treatment plans revolve around an accurate diagnosis of the problem before choosing suitable, comprehensive treatment plan. Access to advanced diagnostic imaging is an important part of ensuring good health by providing a clear diagnosis. The following three imaging modalities are commonly used for sports medicine evaluations and diagnosis:

Computed Tomography (CT) developed specifically for the horse are now available. CT images provide three-dimensional, cross-sectional imaging of bone at high resolution. CT is fast, taking only 60 to 90 seconds to capture multiple images. In areas such



sports Medicine......from p. 49 as the head, CT enables imaging of over-lapping dental and sinus structures that is limited with radiography.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) provides two-dimensional, cross-sectional imaging allowing assessment of structures in multiple planes. MRI imaging is beneficial for soft tissue structures, especially within the hoof capsule. Providing superior detail, MRI is sensitive for detection of bone injury such as navicular bone degeneration, fractures, and bone contusion. MRI is also beneficial when locating specific soft tissue regions for targeted therapeutic injection.

Nuclear Scintigraphy ("bone scan") involves the intravenous administration of a radioactive isotope. Once distributed through the blood supply, the radioactive tracer binds to areas of bone inflammation or remodeling. The isotope within the horse emits gamma radiation, detected by a gamma camera.

**Images** from nuclear scintigraphy identify "hot spots" areas with more gamma radiation emission - an indicator that an injury may be located at that site. Nuclear medicine provides early recognition of a range of bone injuries, and can be helpful for some soft tissue injury at bone attachment and systemic muscle disease. Bone scans are a great scanning tool for determining si a focal or multiple site injury causing variable clinical signs or performance problems, which

are unable to be localized with orthopedic examinations. Once the bone scan is performed, your veterinarian can hone in on the areas in question identified on the scan.

Once a diagnosis is made, physical rehabilitation will improve comfort and promote healing. Along with traditional medical and surgical interventions, physiotherapy will accelerate recovery after injury, manage pain after surgery, and improve the overall wellbeing of your horse. So what options are available and when should rehabilitation therapies be considered?

Rehabilitation therapies should be considered after a surgical procedure, but also when you notice *any performance related changes in your horse.* Uneven gaits, refusal to perform usual tasks or unusual anxiety and behavioral changes, all signal your horse may be physically uncomfortable.

Physiotherapy options include
Extracorporeal Shockwave
Therapy (ESWT), Low-Level
Laser Therapy (LLLT),
Regenerative Therapies,
Acupuncture, Chiropractic,
and individualized exercise
plans.

**ESWT** has been a mainstay in treating soft tissue injuries with proven results. ESWT works to improve cellular communication to release growth factors and improve formation of new blood vessels to the injured area.

Low-Level Laser Therapy
(LLLT) is making its way to the
forefront of veterinary medicine
with documented results for
improving many types of injuries
including bone, soft tissue and
wounds. LLLT works to improve
cellular signaling to decrease
inflammation and promote cell
healing.

Depending on the type of injury your horse has sustained, **Regenerative Therapies** may also be a possibility. Autologous Conditioned Serum (ACS), Platelet Rich Plasma (PRP), or Stem Cell options are beneficial for localized treatment of injuries.

And, in the mix of today's elective treatments, are adjunctive therapies manual such as acupuncture and chiropractic therapy. Acupuncture, based on traditional Chinese medicine, restores function by stimulating the nervous, circulatory and immune systems. Used to alleviate musculoskeletal from injury or disease, gastrointestinal disease or other internal organ dysfunctions, acupuncture also helps with allergy or immunemediate diseases, and alleviates fear and anxiety in your horse.

Proven to deliver effective healing and therapeutic value in specific situations, chiropractic therapy addresses the malalignment of the horse's skeletal structure, which can affect gait and negatively affect organs and nerve pathways. More noted to improve lameness, gait abnormalities and improve

muscle function, chiropractic treatment also improves response to infections and corrects undesirable behavioral issues.

Once the physiological and psychological aspect of your horse's health have been addressed, success as horse and rider team hinges on many other factors. Rider fitness, tack fit, and equine nutrition are equally important. Asymmetries in the musculoskeletal system of the horse interestingly often mirror those of its rider. Horses will compensate for an unbalanced rider and incorrect fitting tack, creating pathways for pain and injury.

With today's latest scientific veterinary advancements, horse owners now have many options for treatment with procedures that can be performed on the farm or in a hospital. Reducing down time for your athlete, detecting smaller issues before they become larger ones, and improve healing from injuries are the goals.

### Manure: A Subject You Can't Ignore

How To Turn It Into Good Stuff

For those who pick stalls daily, it may come as little surprise that a 1000-pound horse produces approximately 50 pounds (wet weight) of manure per day or over eight tons per year. Although pasture-based horses may not generate the large manure pile stalled horses do, every horse owner will benefit from a manure management plan. Spreading (fresh) manure, composting, and off-site hauling at various stages may all be included in the plan, depending upon the number of animals and available acreage.

When manure is openly stockpiled or builds up in paddocks, it has the potential to contaminate both ground and surface water through run-off. Stockpiled manure may contain parasitic larvae, attracts flies and other pests, and takes up space that may be better suited for other uses. Managing manure as a potential resource as opposed to treating it solely as waste, can facilitate on-site nutrient cycling, improve soil quality in pastures and cut down on removal costs.

Manure contains nutrients (Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium) as well as a variety of micro-nutrients required for plant life. Thus, pastures, hay and crop fields, gardens and

landscaping are all potential end points. Although horse manure may not be as popular with gardeners and farmers due to perceived high weed seed content, spreading fresh material may be a viable part of a sound manure management plan.

If a horse owner has suitable equipment and adequate land base, completing a manure sample analysis and a soil test on the field that will receive the application is an important first step. Virginia Cooperative Extension (VCE) agents and Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) certified nutrient management planners can assist landowners in interpreting test results and selecting the best application time/season and rate.

Large equine operations as well as those without a significant land base, will likely exceed the limits of basic manure spreading. Actively composting (managing decomposition) a significant quantity of the manure may be an alternative management strategy.

Whether simply stockpiling or selecting a composting site, there are several important considerations. In general, a welldrained site, fairly flat space with surrounding vegetation that can continued on p. 57

Manure......from p. 55 act as natural filter is best. Since oxygen is a required component for composting, adequate air flow is also important.

Many localities prohibit storing manure and/or building structures within a certain distance of a property line, with 100 feet being common, so local ordinances should be checked in advance. A set-back should also be applied to any nearby well heads, streams and ponds. In addition, convenience to a water hydrant should be considered.

When creating a pad for composting bins, compacted sod or soil is recommended to avoid issues related to excessive run-off and drainage. In instances where soil type poses a risk to proper composting, a hardened pad may be needed to limit runoff and facilitate mixing.

When devising a bin system, first determine how many animals will be contributing to the composters and add bins accordingly. The Northeast Recycling Council, Inc. suggests a two-bin system for one to three 1000-pound animals and a three-bin system for up to five animals. Horse operations with three bins, typically fill one at a time, so each is at a different stage of decomposition. Material that is ready to be applied to pastures is not covered with fresh manure.

Frequently, bins are constructed as 8'x 8' x 3' squares with corner posts installed a minimum of three feet below ground. Composting bins are typically built from wood, but other materials, such as concrete, can be used. It is recommended that building materials be rot-resistant, but not treated with chemicals or pesticides.

Residents located in the Upper Goose Creek Watershed in Northern Fauquier County are encouraged to contact to the John Marshall Soil and Water Conservation District for technical assistance and potential funding opportunities for equine manure composting units.

Composting requires a proper mixture of materials, airflow, moisture content, and upkeep to facilitate the process of material breakdown from microbe activity. These components also help to kill pathogens, weeds, and chemicals while retaining



Composting bins don't require a roof but having one helps maintain the proper temperature of the compost by keeping the material warmer in the winter. It also allows the property owner to control the amount of moisture.

beneficial nutrients. Horse manure typically meets the ideal Carbon to Nitrogen ratio of 25:1-30:1 however the addition of bedding material can sometimes bring this C:N ratio to 40:1 or higher. If wood shavings or other high carbon content bedding is used, additional nitrogen sources such as grass clippings may need to be added to the compost to bring it in balance.

To allow for proper airflow, it is recommended that the compost pile be turned weekly either by hand or mechanically. As an alternative, perforated pipe can be inserted into the active compost pile to provide necessary airflow (See Virginia Cooperative Extension's Manure Management publications, 2009). Using of a composting thermometer to monitor internal temperatures is suggested, with 160 degrees F being the target to kill pathogens, weeds, and other unwanted components in the compost. To maintain these temperatures, the compost bins should be covered in colder weather.

A variety of manure composting resources are available on-line and from local offices of Virginia Cooperative Extension, USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service and regional solid waste authorities.

### Loudoun's Unpaved Roads Win Historic Designation

Lifeline for Equestrians Recognized By State

For top-level combined driving competitor Paula Bliss, Loudoun County's unpaved roads provide the necessary space and surface for conditioning her horses. These rural roads have been named a "Most Endangered Historic Place" by Preservation Virginia.

Loudoun County's unique interconnected network of old unpaved roads dating back to the 18th and 19th centuries is under threat from increasing traffic and development. On May 19, Loudoun's rural road network was officially named as a "Most Endangered Historic Place" by Preservation Virginia, the state's leading preservation advocate, because of its great historic significance and the imminent threat of losing it to pressures for widening, straightening and paving.

Loudoun's nearly 300 miles of dirt and gravel roads have been an essential resource for the county's economically important equestrian industry for generations. It is not a coincidence that Loudoun has the State's largest equine population and also has the largest network of unpaved roads in the state. These historic roads provide critical space for equine exercise, trail rides, carriage rides and support Loudoun's foxhunting tradition.

Over many decades Loudoun's \$180 million equestrian industry

has benefitted from the well-preserved network of old roads. The Loudoun County Equine Alliance (LCEA), which advocates for the horse industry in the county, has described the value of the road network to local politicians.

"Our unpaved road network is vital to the equestrian community because it provides places to ride and drive horses, both for recreation and conditioning," according to the LCEA. "The unpaved surfaces offer natural traffic calming, which is essential for the safety of horses in the road, and a surface that provides the necessary traction for horses as well. They are an important feature of our equestrian heritage, an essential part of Loudoun's identity, and a key component of its strong rural economy. six-billion-dollar Loudoun's tourism industry depends on drawing visitors to its beautiful rural vistas, of which the roads are a part."

A 2015 survey of the economic impact of the horse industry continued on p. 61

gravel Loudoun's roads are essential for foxhunters. The northern Virginia rural countryside has earned a worldwide reputation among the sport's enthusiasts. An avid foxhunter and Loudoun resident from Unison points out that "Gravel roads allow horses and hounds to be exercised in a safe environment year-round but they are especially valuable on the many winter days when the fields and trails are frozen." She also notes that when soft ground would make it destructive for a hunt to cross a landowner's fields. riders can follow on the gravel roads and stay in touch with hounds. "Without gravel roads we would have to cancel many days of hunting and would be hard pressed to deliver sport at the highest level," she says. "We are incredibly fortunate to have kept intact as many gravel roads as we have, and it makes us the envy of visiting foxhunters who have not been so lucky."

In addition to foxhunting, Loudoun is home to a vibrant carriage driving community.

Douglas Kemmerer "personal pleasure" from taking people who have never ridden in a horse-drawn vehicle out for rides in his four-in-hand carriage on the unpaved roads, delighting in what he describes as a "Disneyland experience" for his guests. He tells the story of taking a former ambassador from the United Kingdom out for a coaching drive and was told by his guest "We have nothing like this in England. He became like a little boy," remembers Kemmerer, recalling the ambassador's excitement. "And I thought, here's a guy who's travelled the world and he had that reaction" to a carriage ride on Loudoun County's unpaved roads, he says.

Loudoun's unpaved road network is unique enough to attract horse driving enthusiasts to locate in the County. Flora Hillman and her husband Owen Snyder moved to Bloomfield in southern Loudoun from Chester County, Pa. 30 years ago,

specifically for the gravel roads on which to drive their Welsh ponies. Chester County also has a reputation as a horse-friendly locale, but, according to Hillman, it didn't compare with Loudoun. "We grabbed a map and started looking and we were astonished at the gravel roads in Loudoun," she recalls of their search for a new home.


So why does this unique and rare network of unpaved roads

According to Richard Gillespie, Historian Emeritus of the Mosby Heritage Area Association, the early settlers of Loudoun "staked out this rich land with a purpose... trade." On the verge of the Civil War, Loudoun was Virginia's richest county, but "the Civil War played out on this land with a heavy hand," says Gillespie. "There was little money for public or private investment in road infrastructure well into the third decade of the 20th century. The existing roads, patched and repaired from time to time, would just have to do. In this sense, they were preserved, or at the very least, not modernized or replaced."

But this critical resource is threatened. Pressure from rapid population growth, increasing traffic and suburban style development prompt calls to pave them over, straighten them and widen them. Paving even small segments of the network can diminish the roads' usefulness to equestrians.

Hunts encountering slippery sections that have been tar and chipped or covered with asphalt (often put on sloping sections) find those dangerous. many riders, the ability to have a continuous loop to ride on is essential, and the equine industry was among those fighting hard to preserve the famous "Philomont Loop" on Greggsville Road several years ago.

The America's Routes project (https://americasroutes.com) works to inform and educate the public, political leaders and government decision makers about this unique heritage resource, and was responsible for nominating the roads to the "Most Endangered Places" designation this year.






